

Pupil Premium Statement

Our allocation for Pupil Premium for **2013-2014** is **£122,400**, based on 136 children in the primary section.

Some of the money is being used to continue with the intervention and support that was given last academic year to narrow the attainment gap for FSM children. In addition to this we will be looking to build upon the good practices that we introduced last year to develop children's social and emotional aspects to learning and widen their experiences.

Contributions were made towards the following in the primary section with our pupil premium spend:

- Installing wireless connections in the portakabins for teachers and pupils to access the internet to enrich learning and add variety to the experiences of learning;
- Purchasing a whole school subscription to Education City, an interactive e-learning resource for teachers and pupils to raise attainment and motivate learners;
- Improving the impact of teaching assistants through appropriate training relating specifically to Teaching and Learning in the classroom;
- Running whole staff training on effective teaching & learning strategies including assessment for learning, differentiation, effective feedback, interactive white board training & APP;
- Whole staff training for raising the quality of teaching and learning by external providers e.g. accelerating learning, questioning, better differentiation, effective use of data etc;
- Recruiting a Pastoral Leader for overseeing the well being of pupils for providing emotional and behavioural support to vulnerable children - this includes Pupil Premium children;
- Recruiting two instructors to provide set teaching, small group intervention classes and one to one support for pupils;
- Providing small group interventions in Literacy and Numeracy to accelerate pupil progress allowing pupils to catch up with their peers;
- Providing 1:1 tutoring for pupils who are significantly below target to accelerate learning in Literacy and Numeracy;
- Implementing new systems for rewards and sanctions; rewarding good behaviour, effort and attainment;
- Subsidising all school trips for pupil premium children making real world learning accessible;
- Providing school book bags giving them an identity and sense of belonging
- Providing free milk as part of a well balanced diet gives them a nutritional start to the day;

- Setting up After School Clubs for homework/ICT giving pupils the opportunity for completing their homework in school, both computer based and written.
- Setting up other After School Clubs for e.g. speaking & listening, fitness and other general games to build pupil confidence, self esteem and skills;
- Organising INSPIRE parent workshops.
- Purchasing Rapid Reading, Writing & Phonics Catch Up Programme;
- Training teaching assistants how to deliver quality Rapid Catch Up Programme;
- Employing a through school SENCO;
- Contribution towards the salary of a P.E coach to improve the quality and provision of P.E;
- Development of a reading buddy scheme;
- Recruiting a Family Liaison Officer to monitor attendance, punctuality and make links with parents;
- Development of an Assessment tracking system to improve systems and efficiency of data analysis;
- Purchasing sports equipment to widen opportunities for children to participate in less well known activities;
- Organising partnerships in sporting events;
- Linking up with other local schools to widen pupils' knowledge and understanding;
- Organising extra-curricular activities to support personal development, raise self esteem & enrich learning;
- Setting up nurture groups to develop social skills and manage emotions;
